Sand, Sand, Sand, but how to get it out

Company A, along with the rest of the 70th Bogineer Battalion was in need of a supply of good sand to be used in their concrete work. CPT David A. Corbett, Commanding Officer of A Company, after recoming an area north of QL 21 along the Ba Krong River, felt sure there was a large amount of sand in that area. A D 7 E dozer was dispatched to the area and after a few hours, uncovered a large deposit of very good sand. After dispatching another D 7 E from A Company which was unable to do the job, two D 9 G's were borrowed from the 610th Engineer Company (CS), and dispatched to the pit. Approximately 25 loads of sand were hauled out of the sand pit before the stockpile was depleted, and due to the condition of the sand pit it is a doubtful whether anymore sand will be removed unless a crane is brought in to do the job. In the meantime, new areas are being developed to keep sand in supply.
